

Holy Comforter Episcopal Church Vestry Synopsis.....

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Holy Comforter Episcopal Parish Vestry was held on November 9, 2010, with Rev. Carol Petty presiding. The meeting was opened with prayer led by Mother Carol at 7:00 p.m.

Present were: Dianne Kilgus, Trey Picard, Barbara Thomas, Ed White, Lola Kay Hood , Chip Cole and Jerry Powell. Also present were 2011 vestry member, SuZan Carpenter and Barbara Marin, Vestry

Mother Carol led the vestry in spiritual reflection.

The minutes of the October 12th regular vestry meeting were presented.

Mother Carol presented a report for HCES. HCEC and HCES are providing 15 children in Brazoria County Protective Custody with three gifts each. Plans are underway for registration for next fall. Priority registration will be offered to HCEC parishioners and HCES returning families before being opened to the public.

Mother Carol gave the junior warden report in James Northrup's absence. James has people lined up and ready to go with renovations to Parish House. A meeting is scheduled for January 9th and James will have drawings and numbers to present to the parish to let them know what progress has been made with the plans for renovating the Parish House and church. James will have a full report for the vestry in December.

Mother Carol welcomed Suzan Carpenter as a newly elected vestry member. She and other new vestry members will be officially installed at our annual meeting on January 23, 2011.

Mother Carol thanked Barbara Thomas for her leadership with the Commitment Drive. Mother Carol reported that Dianne Kilgus and the finance committee are working on the 2011 budget. She also reported that James Northrup and Lori Hawkins are working on her evaluation. She reported that Advent begins on November 28th and this year's theme is Living In Hope.

Due to Stephanie being out on vacation no financial report was given. The October and November report will be presented for review and approval at the December meeting.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 8:05 p.m. with prayer led by Mother Carol.
